# COLONEL MATTHEW R. ALTMAN, P.E., PhD

Col Matthew Altman is the Commander, 47th Mission Support Group at 47th Flying Training Wing, Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas. He is responsible for the quality of life and mission support to 5,700 people and 28 units, providing logistics, engineering, housing, security, personnel, education, contracting, communication, services, along with war fighting readiness training. He maintains oversight and protection of assets valued at \$1.3B, to include 808 infrastructure assets, 9.5 miles of runways and taxiways, along with 451 housing units on 5,343 acres supporting the undergraduate pilot training mission. He is also responsible for keeping forces ready to deploy in support of contingency operations worldwide.

Colonel Matthew R. Altman recently completed Senior Development Education in-residence at the U.S. Naval War College, Newport, Rhode Island. He entered the Air Force in 2002 through the Reserve Officer Training Corps at the University of Notre Dame where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering and Master of Business Administration. Col Altman has commanded two civil engineer squadrons and served on combatant command and major command staffs, as well as three base level engineer assignments. Additionally, he was assigned as a Defense Legislative Fellow in the office of U.S. Senator Lisa Murkowski. In total, Col Altman has over 19 years of command, civil engineering and staff experience including three deployments to Southwest



Asia in support of Operations IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM. Prior to his current position, the colonel was the Commander, 5th Civil Engineer Squadron, Minot AFB, North Dakota.
