### COLONEL JOSEPH D. MCCANE

Colonel Joseph “Angry” McCane is currently serving as the Commander of the 47<sup>th</sup> Operations Group, Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas. He is responsible for overseeing the direct training of United States Air Force and allied partners, while also leading 1,100 active duty, civilian, and reserve personnel. As the largest pilot training base in the world, Laughlin graduates more than 350 student pilots each year. The group operates 209 aircraft, consisting of the T-1A, T-6A, and T-38C valued at more than \$1.3 billion, and flies more than 81,000 hours and 56,000 sorties per year.

Col McCane enlisted in the Air Force in August 1991 as an Air Transportation Specialist and separated from Active Duty in 1996 at the rank of Senior Airman. He then commissioned through the Air Force ROTC program at the University of Oklahoma in 2001. Following commissioning, he entered Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training at Laughlin AFB, Texas and was selected to remain as a First Assignment Instructor Pilot (FAIP) in the T-1A Jayhawk. Following his tour in AETC, Col McCane went to AMC to fly the C-17A Globemaster III and deployed several times in support of the Global War on Terrorism. Later, he was assigned to a specialized unit where he flew the C-208 Grand Caravan, DHC-6 Twin Otter, BE-350 King Air and the C-130 E/H Hercules. He has had staff assignments at the MAJCOM and higher levels. He has deployed multiple times to Iraq, Afghanistan, and the Mediterranean in support of multiple contingency operations. Col McCane is a Command Pilot with over 1,500 combat hours and over 5,800 hours in the T-37C, T-6A, T-1A, C-17, C-130 E/H, BE-350, DHC-6, and C-208. He and his wife, Lori McCane, have one son.
