



Colonel Eric “SPA” Bissonette

Col. Eric Bissonette is the Commander, 47th Flying Training Wing, Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas. The wing consists of 2,200 personnel conducting undergraduate pilot training for more than 700 United States Air Force and allied student pilots each year. The wing operates 160 aircraft, consisting of T-6A and T-38C, and flies more than 57,000 hours and more than 41,000 sorties annually. The wing also supports elements of Joint Task Force - Southern Border as a part of USNORTHCOM's efforts to secure and seal the southern border, ensuring U.S. territorial integrity.

Col. Bissonette entered the Air Force in June 2000 as a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy. He earned his wings at Vance AFB, Oklahoma in 2002 and has served in a variety of operational and training positions throughout his career including commanding the 71st Operations Group at Vance AFB, Oklahoma and the 558th Flying Training Squadron at Randolph AFB, Texas. He is a graduate of USAF Air Command and Staff College and US Army War College.

Col. Bissonette is a command pilot with more than 3,200 flying hours and led combat missions in support of OPERATIONS IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM.
