COLONEL NATHAN A. THOMPSON

Colonel Nathan A. Thompson is the Vice Commander of the 47th Flying Training Wing, Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas. The wing consists of more than 2,800 personnel conducting specialized undergraduate pilot training for more than 511 U.S. Air Force and allied student pilots each year. The wing operates 210 aircraft, consisting of the T-1A, T-6A and T-38C, and flies more than 83,800 flying hours and 57,100 sorties per year.

Colonel Thompson graduated from the United States Air Force Academy in 2000. He is a command pilot with more than 2,100 hours including assignments flying F-15Cs in Europe and Alaska, teaching introduction to fighter fundamentals in Georgia and Oklahoma, and instructing undergraduate pilot training in Texas. Col Thompson previously commanded the 469th Flying Training Squadron at Sheppard AFB, Texas. He served in the 607th Air Support Operations Group and Seventh Air Force in Osan Air Base, South Korea. Prior to his current position, Colonel Thompson was the Chief of the Joint Fires Division, United States European Command, Stuttgart, Germany.
